#### Introduction



Joint events and partner collaborations created opportunities for faculty and students to connect, share experiences, and expand professional networks, strengthening ties across the consortium.






Support for Academic Staff and Students

#### Individual Event at Partner HEI


A session focused on *The Impact of Erasmus on Personal Growth*,

An engaging session on Erasmus and Career Development & International Networking took place, drawing interest from international students, faculty, and staff.






#### **Administrative Staff Joint Event**

### Event Highlights: Empowering Global Opportunities








#### Erasmus Days - Erasmus+ Info Day





On October 15, IUST collaborated with EUROPE HOUSE in Struga to host an Erasmus+ Info Day, bringing together over 100 participants, including students, academic staff, and young learners. Representatives from the National Erasmus+ Agency led informative sessions on the benefits and logistics of Erasmus+ programs, covering:

#### Interactive Q&A and Networking

The Info Day concluded with a lively Q&A session, allowing participants to ask questions about applications, resources, and program benefits. A coffee break provided opportunities for individual consultations with National Agency representatives, and attendees received **Erasmus+** materials to take home.



#### Introductory Sessions on Erasmus+ Programs

#### Funding and Application Guidance for Academic Staff
